Summer Exhibit

The sign says "Open July and August from 1:00 to 4:30." That's accurate, at least for the exhibit. Anita Campbell chaired the exhibit committee this year, doing a wonderful job. *Sandstone Architecture of the Copper Country* was spectacular! Pictures by Mike Forgrave highlighted familiar and unfamiliar buildings constructed from Jacobsville sandstone. Kathryn Eckhart's talk at the Open House provided background and additional information to a full house. The exhibit, funded through a grant from the Advisory Commission for the Keweenaw National Historical Park, moved to the Carnegie Museum in Houghton after the Heritage Center closed in September. Nearly 2000 visitors enjoyed the exhibit and the building during open hours in July and August.



Community Events

Things were happening at the corner of Fifth and Scott Streets in Calumet before the Open House. Lots of things. People and organizations have discovered that the Keweenaw Heritage Center is a great place for different activities. In May, harking back to the 1959 Sacred Heart High School's Commencement held here in St. Anne's, Horizons High School's Commencement Ceremony awarded diplomas and congratulated graduates. Early in June, the Heritage Center Board hosted an informational breakfast for members of the business community. July saw the Pine Mountain Music Festival hold its Organ Concert on the 1898 Barckhoff Organ. Life Line Screening set up their equipment to give community people assessments of their health.

Looking for a great place for a family gathering, meeting place, or celebration of a life event?

Plan your next event at the Keweenaw Heritage Center. Here's what you need to know.

Keweenaw Heritage Center Rental Information

- Rental information for Lower Level -

Guidelines:

- No smoking
- Decorations may not be attached to walls
- The area must be cleaned and trash removed before leaving
- Entry doors must be locked and the key returned to KHC staff by 12 pm (Midnight)
- Damage done to the building or grounds due to misuse by anyone during the rental period is the sole responsibility of the person signing the rental agreement

This agreement is not transferable to any other party

- Rental Rates for either level -

- * Meetings up to 2 hours: \$25
- * Meetings up to 6 hours: \$75
- * Full day (12 hour maximum)...\$125

- Rental information for Weddings or Concerts -

Rental Rates of the building for Weddings and Concerts..... \$250 - *due 60 days in advance*

* There will also be a \$250 security deposit which will be refunded within 10 business days provided all areas of the Keweenaw Heritage Center is left clean and in good condition.

* Cancellation 30 days prior to the reserved day will result in a full refund of rental fee and deposit.

Cancellation less than 30 days from the reserved date will only lead to a refund of the deposit.

* The rental charge covers the use of the facility for a setup period (daytime hours prior to the reserved day – to be arranged with KHC staff), and for a 3 hour cleanup period the day after the event (between 9am and noon). Additional cleanup time will be charged \$15/hour.

Additional Guidelines for Weddings or Concerts:

- 1) Calumet Township must be named as an additional insured on the Renter's homeowners policy with a minimum \$100,000 liability.
- 2) Renter must provide control of alcoholic beverages to people of legal age.
- 3) Incidents arising out of the consumption of alcohol, whether from excessive use or under age drinking, are the sole responsibility of the persons renting the KHC.
